- ❖ Dealt with Sheraton Fairplex, finalizing the contract & correcting typographical errors.

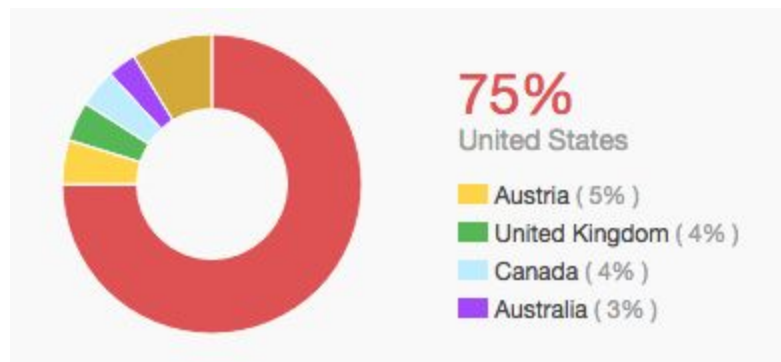

Trustee Report by Hannah S.

There are still several groups in our region not affiliated with an intergroup. Our IG Outreach Committee has been working on contacting these groups and to inform them about the benefits. Affiliated members attend IG meetings (mostly once-a-month) and take back information to their groups. Intergroup events, e.g. workshops and other special events, will be emailed to the group secretary. Many meetings may be in remote areas and it is difficult and timely to get to the intergroup meetings. Therefore, many intergroups now are set up for partial or all telephone and/or computer meetings. This way every group can be represented at the intergroup meetings.

The Outreach Committee has not been very successful getting groups in Mexico to register. Language is a big problem since members in rural areas may not speak English. Our R2 vice-chair has been very helpful to get such groups affiliated with intergroups in their area.

I believe we are communicating more and more through virtual means. As you all know we have many virtual meetings. A motion may be brought to the floor at the next WSBC (World Service Business Conference) to add an additional region (Region 11) to eliminate the confusion for virtual meetings to register in their region or with the Virtual Service Board. I have been asked if a virtual group can register with both – their region (ours being Region 2) and also the Virtual Service Board. A group can only be affiliated with one or the other. By making the Virtual Service Board a separate region, this confusion will be eliminated.

There are still many intergroups who have not brought their by-laws up-to-date. World Service recommends updating the by-laws every two years. Usually there are changes (voted on at the WSBC) that affect the intergroup by-laws, so it is best to send them to the trustee every second year. Any questions, please contact me through the R2 website. I will also be available to answer questions during our Region 2 Spring Assembly.

Another item, often misunderstood, is the usage of our OA logo. Groups or intergroups may use the OA logo for workshop information or other events. However, permission is needed from World Service. A simple form needs to be completed and sent to WS and the request, as far as I know, has never been denied. Form are available at:

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Intergroup Outreach Committee Report

At the Fall 2017 Region 2 Assembly, our committee decided to continue contacting unaffiliated meetings and help them with registering with an intergroup, which included both emails and phone calls to meeting contacts. This time we had some success with getting a response from meetings and learned that many were unaware of intergroups and how they can support their meetings and offer resources.

At the current time, new meetings can register online through World Service Organization (WSO), which makes joining an intergroup optional. Without knowledge about intergroups and how they work, meetings can continue missing out on the opportunities that come with being a part of an intergroup and the Region.

Projects Underway:

- As a committee we've suggested via the Region 2 Trustee that WSO assign new meetings to an intergroup in their area during the registration process, with an option to opt out if they wish.
- We have plans to translate the steps to register with an intergroup into Spanish.
- Carolina, the Region 2 Vice Chair will assist our committee with contacting the Spanish speaking meetings in Mexico.

Young Persons Committee Report

The purpose of the Young Persons Committee is to carry the message of recovery to the Young Person who still suffers.

- Zoyer has been training Jeri in her new role as secretary of YP committee
- Last Fall our committee worked on and now have a living document
- 'Speaker List' for young people who are willing to speak in Region
- The committee received information on high schools---committee plans to create a draft to send to IG's regarding YP outreach
- We continued work on translating the YP Fact Sheet into Spanish

Public Information Committee Report

The Public Information Committee submitted monthly electronic articles for use by Region 2 Intergroups, suggesting actions groups or individuals can take to carry the message into our communities to those who are still suffering.

The December column offered specific opportunities to carry the message during the 'trifecta' of winter holidays consumed by families and food. For January, the committee addressed outreach by our local meetings and our intergroups to our Spanish-speaking communities. The upcoming message for February will include general suggestions for carrying the message into our communities.

The PI group will meet assess our contribution so far and make a new goal for the next time period.

Bylaws Committee Report

The Bylaws committee does not have a report at this time.

12 Step Within Committee Report

The goals for the TSW Committee are to:

- Set up and staff a booth at the R2 Convention in June 2018 to display the "Welcome Back, We Care" packets from WSO. (These are ordered.)
- Provide highlighted order forms for the packets
- Provide a list of TSW ideas from the TSW Handbook to facilitate the broader dissemination of this information. (Will be completed at this assembly.)
- Provide handouts of the TSW Speaker list or referrals to the R2 Website Speaker list.
- Suggest to the WSO publications designer that we add a note on the outside of the "Welcome back, We Care" packet which allows room for the listing of local members to call, similar to that on the outside of the "Welcome" packet given to new members.

We are contacting the other nine regions for ideas of what has worked in their regions for reaching out to those within the rooms who are still suffering. We are interested in the activities they have developed and we are willing to share our efforts in order to inspire them. So far we have gathered input From:

- Co chairs of the TSW Conference Committee referred us to excellent resources at oa.org/groupservice-bodies/resources/twelfth-step-within/
- R7 has a small TSW committee which distributed the TSW Handbook and discussed what groups in each IG are doing for TSW, approved a new statement of purpose to align with TSW Committee at WSBC, created a budget and will discuss the new TSW Step Study book.
- R8 has a very attractive web presence on the R8 website where they provide easy access to TSW information. They provide mentoring, present workshops, and try to take information to groups in their region.

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- R9 has no TSW committee this year but they post the available workshops on the Region website. They are focusing on translations, group support for worldwide recovery and Public Information this year.

Diversity Committee Report

The Unity with Diversity committee is working on making OA diversity resources more visible and accessible to our fellows. We aim to highlight Tradition Three, which states “The only requirement for OA membership is a desire to stop eating compulsively,” by extending support to intergroups to ensure no fellow is excluded or made to feel unwelcome in meeting rooms or any other part of our recovery program.

We are in the process of creating a database for OA diversity resources and hope to publish this on the Region 2 website, along with a flyer that we will pass out at the next Region 2 assembly for representatives to take home to their intergroups. This will provide information and instructions on how to access a number of OA diversity resources, such as the Unity with Diversity Policy. We hope that compiling these resources in a single place will encourage fellows to explore the OA stance on diversity and to assess how this is working within their respective intergroups.

We also wish to reach out to our fellows in Region 2 to encourage feedback and ideas regarding Unity with Diversity and how to make our program more inclusive. We are additionally working on creating a few short activities for intergroups to use in addressing issues of diversity at the meeting level and beyond, so that we can promote discussions about inclusion, acceptance and respect in our program as an integral part of mental, physical and spiritual recovery.

Saturday, October 28, 2017

8:30am to 4:00pm

Called to Order: Meeting called to order 8:30 by Chair Anne O.

- Opened with Welcome, Serenity Prayer
- Green Dot recognition & Mentor assignments

Readings: Assembly Rules read by Parliamentarian, Concepts of Service read by Trustee

Introductions:

- Board members, R2 trustee and parliamentarian introductions
- Request Cell phones turned off and away.
- Acknowledge Retiring Reps and Board Members

Roll Call: A quorum was established with 19 intergroups, 27 RRs were present, 6 voting board members, 2 alternates and 1 trustee.

Ice Breaker: an ice-breaker activity was conducted.

Board Reports:

Secretary: Ask-it basket process, Old sign was claimed, Evaluation form Reminder.

Publications Coordinator: Invited folks to download podcasts.

Events Coordinator: Dates for upcoming Assemblies and Conventions

- R2 Spring Assembly 2018 April 13-14 Crowne Plaza Sacramento
- R2 Convention 2018 June 29-July 1 Crowne Plaza Sacramento
- R2 Fall Assembly 2018 November 2-4th, Pomona Sheraton
- R2 Spring Assembly 2019 March 29, 30th Pomona Sheraton

Requests intergroups stay at the hotel for assemblies and conventions.

Chair: Explained that next year the Region chairs will be joining us at the Fall Assembly and gave the taxonomy of the 10 regions. Asked for volunteers putting on the Forum at the WSBC in 2018.

Treasurer: Reminded folks that not many folks are taking advantage of the options for financial support. Her IG (Northern Nevada) is offering scholarships to their meetings for 2018 convention.

Vice-Chair: The SCT workshops are available on request. We did 3 this year.

R2 Trustee: Introduced the "Tradition pocket card", "Strong Meeting Checklist" and "12-Stepping a Problem" and offered them to anyone present. Special sale on 2 books "Overeaters Anonymous" and "Beyond our Wildest Dreams". Some IGs still need to update their Bylaws based on the WSO Bylaw updates. World Service updates literature, so check to make sure you have the latest. If you want to change something, have a business meeting in your group if you want to customize your meetings.

Intergroup and Region Concerns:

- Intergroup Mexico shared a thing they are doing... a can to use to collect small change.
- Sonoma county- having trouble getting people to come to their IG meetings, held a Meet and Greet to try to address this. It seemed successful, and will do it again.
- San Joaquin valley IG is a large geographic IG and has Virtual IG meeting. Found a local IG that gave them an account for free.
- Sonoma county IG brought Newsletter meeting list in back of the room

A: Call World Service and see if they know about any. Look in the paper, or City Calendars and Hospitals. IF you find one in which you want to participate, contact R2 Trustee to get support for literature and possible funding.

Q: What are the requirements to be a board member?

A: They were read from Page 8 and 9 of the Bylaws which can be found on-line at oar2.org/documents.

Follow-on question – Thomas read the requirements for the R2 Board and it included "Abstinence as being defined by the individual" person. Isn't that a conflict if the person is not "at or approaching a healthy body weight?" Since the OA definition includes this.

A: There is a possibility for a conflict. The bylaws are as currently documented and are not necessarily in conflict with WSO definition. This can be addressed if interested by the Bylaws committee or by a RR motion to amend the bylaws.

Q: Can we invite you to do an SCT workshop on 10th Tradition- Outside issues.

A: Yes, Submit a request to Vice Chair, and she will schedule them.

Q: Have the rules changed to help new meetings get literature. Looking for starter pack of literature, but didn't find it.

A: Region 2 has a budget item to help meetings that are starting. Email Treasure to get help with this.

Q: Could you please clarify the "suggested closing prayers"...

A: Group can open meeting with any prayer and close with approved prayers, have your group decide. Approved prayers are on WS website <https://oa.org/members/strength-and-hope/prayers/>. This includes Rosanne's Promise.

Q: We have a need in Santa Cruz for a meeting in Spanish. How can we get help for this?

A: Give a call to Lizanne who started one in Gilroy. 408-410-7074.

Follow-on Q1: How does and IG handle having someone in an IG position with a required abstinence but it appears over an extended period of time that the person might not qualify.

A: It was suggested that this should be handled in a one-on-one conversation, asking them "What is going on?" and not making assumptions (there are medical reasons for possible weight gain unrelated to food.) Be Kind.

Q: Is there any recommended order of reading OA literature?

A: Yes, the order in which your sponsor suggests.

Q: What are the examples of items needed/wanted for the convention sale fund raiser?

A: New Electronics, and new items. Themed gift baskets. For boutique... new or gently used clothing and items.

Q: Does anyone know of a post-bariatric focused meeting that is online or phone?

A: No, that is an outside issue. World Service determined that.

Q: How to increase meeting & intergroup attendance? We are dying!

A: Our numbers are shrinking everywhere; it is up to us to grow the fellowship. Share that you are in OA if you do not need the anonymity. Call people who have not been to meetings for a while. Do service at the intergroup.

Q: On page 5 of the Packet it says "Bylaws can only be changed at spring assembly." Is that true?

A: No, that is not true.

Q: Our intergroup has an OA member not from our area attend our 2017 retreat. He sexually harassed quite a few of our members and spoke a lot about one of the sex recovery 12-step programs while not talking about food recovery... Do you have suggestions as to how to talk to him? Our intergroup is considering not allowing him to come in future years. Keeping Tradition 3 in mind, can we disinvite him because of safety concerns?

A: No, we cannot disinvite people, but if he does register to attend again the Retreat chair should talk to him about his behavior and his impact on the retreat, and mention his discussing other programs. Experience Sacramento Rep: This occurred in their meetings- Several people went to talk to his sponsor, this helped temporarily, then it recurred and the when he returned they terminated meetings when he came, and called police. Finally restraining order had to be set up for certain members.

Q: Is there some method to involve local Igs for hotel selection Re: Location?

A: This has been asked for several times, with no responses. You are always welcome to send your suggestions at any time.

Q: How do we get more boutique flyers for our group?
