

Did you know that OA has a Strategic Operations Plan? Following are the 4 sections of the plan with some of the results or suggestions from the plan.

#### Public/Professional Awareness:

We now have new Radio and TV PSA's which have been widely distributed. A&E Family of Cable Channels will be airing the TV PSA in rotation indefinitely!

#### Strong Meetings:

Intergroups are encouraged to hold sponsorship workshops and have Step and Tradition study meetings. When you share at a meeting, it is suggested that you include your experiences with the Steps, Traditions and Sponsorship. If you are a sponsor, encourage your sponsee to sponsor.

#### **Committed Service Bodies:**

<u>Fund a Friend</u>: Does your Intergroup have funds to send a Region Representative (RR) to the R2 Assemblies and/or a delegate to WSBC, but you have no one willing able and qualified to go? Consider helping a neighboring Intergroup, with the opposite problem, to send their RR or Delegate to the meetings.

<u>FYI:</u> Region 2 also has a WSBC Delegate Assistance Fund, an Intergroup Funding Assistance Program, and an Intergroup Assembly Scholarship Fund. We want you to send reps and delegates!

#### Financial Health.

Has your Intergroup been able to cut costs? Please share your successes in this newsletter and at assemblies. My Intergroup was able to cut costs by finding a cheaper and better web server, by using a simpler telephone service and by printing fewer newsletters because members were receiving it by email.


#### **Need Help Sending Someone to World Service?**

It's really important that your intergroup send delegates to World Service Business Conference! If you are having difficulty financing expenses, you have several options:

**First:** Apply to World Service for assistance. Applications for the Delegate Support Fund are due at World Service November 1<sup>st</sup> and are available at oa.org.

Second: Another option is the new Region 2WSBC Delegate Assistance Fund. The Region 2 assembly body has voted to provide funds to help up to 3 intergroups per year send delegates to the World Service business Conference. #### Does Your Intergroup Need Help to Attend Assemblies?

If funding is a problem for your intergroup, you have a variety of options:

#### **Intergroup Funding Assistance Pro-**

gram: If your intergroup is more than approximately 150 miles away from the assembly location, you will receive the most benefit from the Intergroup Funding Assistance Program (IFAP), which provides 45 cents a mile for the oneway distance between the intergroup's street or post office address and the assembly location. In addition, half of that amount is provided for a second voting delegate. Intergroups can now apply for the funding in advance of the assembly, so that the amount they will receive can be confirmed in advance. Watch the R2 website for deadline.

#### **Intergroup Assembly Scholarship**

Fund: If your intergroup is within approximately 150 miles of the assembly location, you will receive maximum benefit from the Intergroup Assembly Scholarship coordinated by the Region 2 Intergroup Outreach Committee. All financially struggling intergroups are eligible for the scholarship, with preference given to intergroups that have not been able to send a representative to recent assemblies. If your intergroup is interested, apply as early as you can, since applications may be considered in the order they are received. This scholarship provides room nights at the hotel (one for the spring assembly, two for the fall assembly) plus \$30 to apply toward transportation and \$50 to apply toward meal costs. Three scholarships are available per assembly.

Special Chair Funding: If a Representative serves as Chair of a Region 2 Committee, but cannot attend on the funding of the intergroup, special funding of up to \$200 may be available to help. For the region to offer these funds to benefit those who need it most, it is important that intergroups do all they can to raise their own funds to participate.

We realize that the use of electronic media raises anonymity concerns. Our committee is working with the Region 2 Board and World Service to ensure that your anonymity is preserved and the blog and phone meetings will be a safe place for all.

#### **Need PI Ideas for Your Intergroup?**

What can YOUR intergroup do for PI projects to spark public interest and bring in new members? To get you inspired, here are some example ideas from Orange County:

For over 20 years, Orange County Intergroup (OCI) has maintained a valuable PI outreach via a booth at the OC Fair. During that time, we ve easily reached over 1,000 people with the message of recovery, all delivered by volunteers from our intergroup. We have won five ribbons for best booth design, including this year, all created by talented OCI volunteers. We also reprinted the "Stop Sign" OA business cards to distribute this year, along with intergroup newsletters & meeting lists of all the area intergroups.

Three years ago, we developed a flyer similar to the "Is Food a Problem for You?", with intergroup telephone number tear-off strips at the bottom, which were distributed to various public bulletin boards in the county.

In September, 2008, OCI was invited by the Bariatric Unit of one of the largest hospitals in the county, and asked to bring an OA meeting to their surgery patients. The director of the new program was very conscientious about having OA offered so that their patients would come to know that unless they dealt with the emotional challenges of compulsive eating, their surgery would not be long-term effective. I was appointed by the then OCI Chair to organize and launch the meeting. We launched the speaker/participation meeting in November, and

had our first meeting in January, 2009.

In the summer of 2009, we were invited to present and join a professional roundtable in OC, which was also a blessing, as it opened the door to carrying the message to the professional community.

OCI was invited to several public health fairs, including one for the Hispanic community, sponsored by a local university. Our Young People s Committee (YPC) is also working closely with our PI Committee on various outreach projects, which include high school and college health fairs and presentations, as well as professional events.

Currently, our PIC has several projects on the front burner:
1) a committed outreach to the medical community, using a
flyer titled, "Got A Shrink, Got a Doc?", whereby members may
enlist the cooperation of their physicians to receive OA professional packets; and 2), a mailing campaign to radio stations in
OC to play OA PSAs (from WSO) on the air.
